May completed our onsite Ukrainian Refugee program. Everyone who is not with their sponsor has moved to a dormitory in Los Angeles, and our two-story building is almost empty again. Thank you, thank you, thank you to all of you who donated items, made meals and grocery runs, did onsite stays, drove, and made it all happen. I have been so impressed by all the volunteer response and compassion. We are awesome!

The Annual Meeting is upon us. I hope to see each of you June 12th fifteen minutes after the service, whether on Zoom or in person. It is our greatest exercise in democracy, and it will determine how the Board will operate for our next fiscal year. Elections and budget approval are always part of the agenda. SIAN'S SHENANIGANS From Our Minister: Rev. Sian Wiltshire

Years ago, I read a book called "The Carmina Gaedelica." It's a collection of Celtic Christian prayers, enchantments and blessings from the 19th Century from the Outer Hebrides of the Scottish Isles, a place that had preserved much of its original pagan roots. When you read the prayers and poems (and, yes, spells/enchantments!) you can tell they are unique immediately; they were all once from the druidic/pagan tradition. When Christianity came along, they just added in Jesus and Mary.

What I loved about this book was how there was a blessing for everything – from



lighting the fire, to milking the cow, to harvesting the wheat. There were big rituals of blessing and smaller ones; but everything was seen in that light. It got me thinking: What might our

days be like if we greeted each day, and each person, as if they were a blessing?

I invite you this month to wake each morning and find something that feels like a blessing — even if it is to turn on the coffee maker, feed the cat/dog or snuggle under the covers.

It was just last year at this time that we were venturing back to our site for the first time in over a year. It has been a roller coaster, as we had to reclose twice for variant threats. At this time, however, we are pleased that, although the case counts are rising, hospitalizations are barely budging. We learned from our survey in March that people are willing to continue to wear masks if necessary to keep our children safe and keep singing. We relaxed the mask requirement in Daniels Hall at the Spring Auction and found that a substantial majority were comfortable without their masks. Hopefully our youngest children will be eligible for vaccinations soon.

For these reasons, we are going to further relax our guidelines. Effective June 19th

once the choir is on its summer hiatus, the guidelines will be:

- Daniels Hall on Sunday mornings Masks optional once the children leave for their classes.
- Religious Education and Administration building Sunday
 Mornings Masks required
- All other times and spaces Masks optional

We will continue to run the fans in Daniels Hall for good ventilation. The speaker/singer screens are down, and we will be adding back the extra row of seats in Daniels Hall that were removed when we reopened. We are even investigating going back to ceramic coffee cups to lessen our impact on the earth!

Some things will stay indefinitely:

- Please stay home if you are feeling unwell.
- Please let our Congregation Nurse know if you test positive for COVID.
- Placing the offertory plate outside the doors instead of passing them.

As always, please speak with any member of the Task Force if you have questions or concerns. We will continue to monitor the Orange County statistics and will meet again in August.

Stitchwits meet on Zoom every Saturday from 10:30am to 12:30pm and are knitting, crocheting, or sewing items for Stand Up for Kids.


